

Dinkey Creek packing list - Duration 2 nights.

Arrive Friday, Aug 23rd. Leave Sunday, Aug 25th.



Elevation is a hair under 6,000 feet altitude.

Dinkey Creek is spread out along the banks of its namesake creek in a thick forest of Ponderosa pines and cedars. The facility's high country setting with trees, streams and open space, make it a scenic destination for all types of visitors. Dinkey Creek has 2 swimming areas: The Slicks and Honeymoon Pool, both of which contain pools carved out of granite. Anglers can fish Dinkey Creek for brown and rainbow trout. Hikers can walk the Dinkey Creek Trail.



Bears frequent the area. This campsite has bear boxes to store food and anything with a scent including trash, soaps, toothpaste, sunscreen, first-aid kits, baby wipes, lotion, scented tissue, air freshener, insect repellent, and tobacco/vape products. Bears recognize ice chests, cans, bottles, and grocery bags, even inside cars, so we'll store them too.

Food-wise Mel and I have a few meals planned. You are more than welcome bring various snack'ems you prefer. Portable Nibbles are a good idea for hikers.

Generally, the quiet hours are 10pm – 6am, though it sort of depends on how many people are there. According to the website, it may be fairly packed. I have 2 sites this year #110. (Max 6 people, 1 car in each) so we have a little wiggle room away from neighbors.

This campsite has water and *gasp* flush toilets at some locations? Is that reeeally camping though? ☺
